National Cadet Corps (NCC) is the largest youth organization of the country. It is a tri-service organization comprising of the Army, Navy and Air Force, engaged in grooming the youth of the country into disciplined and patriotic citizens. It was established in the year 1949 in its present form, though it follows the legacy of University Cadet Corps, established in 1917. It is administered by the Ministry of Defence, Govt. of India. Its motto is 'Unity and Discipline'.

Tarakeswar Degree College NCC Coy-3/3 acts under 3 Bengal Battalion NCC(Army Wing). It is a combined company, giving equal opportunities to both girls and boys, and having strength of 150 students from various departments. Regular parade sessions are conducted in the college ground.

## NCC: AT A GLANCE

---

The NCC in India was formed the National Cadet Corps Act of 1948. It can be traced back to the 'University Corps', which was created under the Indian Defence Act 1917, with the objective to make up for the shortage in the Army. In 1920, when the Indian Territorial Act was passed, the 'University Corps' was replaced by the 'University Training Corps' (UTC). The aim was to raise the status of the UTC and make it more attractive to the youth. The UTC Officers and cadets dressed like the army. It was a significant step towards the Indianization of armed forces.

In 1948, the Girls Division was raised in order to give equal opportunities to school and college going girls. The NCC was given an inter-service image in 1950 when the Air Wing was added, followed by the Naval Wing in 1952. In the same year, the NCC curriculum was extended to include community development/social service activities as a part of the NCC syllabus. National Cadet Corps (NCC) is a youth organization under the Ministry OF Defence which ensured multifaceted development of youth with a sense of duty, commitment, dedication, discipline and moral values.

The 'Aims' of the NCC laid out in 1988 have stood the test of time and continue to meet the requirements expected of it in the current socio-economic scenario of the country. The NCC aims at developing character, comradeship, discipline, a secular outlook, the spirit of adventure and ideals of selfless service amongst young citizens. Further, it aims at creating a pool of organized, trained and motivated youth with leadership qualities in all walks of life, who will serve the Nation regardless of which career they choose. Needless to say, the NCC also provides an environment conducive to motivating young Indians to join the armed forces.

The need for having motto for the Corps was discussed in the 11th Central Advisory Committee (CAC) meeting held on 11 Aug 1978. The mottos suggested were 'Duty and Discipline'; 'Duty, Unity and Discipline'; 'Duty and Unity'; 'Unity and Discipline'. The final decision for selection of "Unity and Discipline" as motto for the NCC was taken in the 12th CAC meeting held on 12 Oct 1980.

## ENROLMENT OF CADETS

The NCC Coy-3/3, at Tarakeswar Degree College operates under the 3 Bengal Bn NCC in West Bengal, with an authorized total strength of 150, inclusive of SD and SW Cadets. The selection process for the cadets involves various activities such as measuring height, completing a 1600-meter run within a specified time, performing push-ups and sit-ups, and considering the merit of the higher secondary exam to ensure the selection of well-suited individuals. The table below presents enrolment details for cadets, categorized as *SD* (Senior Division) and *SW* (Senior Wing), session-wise.

Cadets who enrolled received institutional training and had the opportunity to participate in adventurous activities, community development programs, various national-level camps, and annual training camps. Additionally, they engaged in youth exchange programs, sports, and cultural activities. The NCC Company of Tarakeswar Degree College falls under the Kolkata B Group of the West Bengal and Sikkim NCC Directorate. Our ANO (Associate NCC Officer) and various other PI (Permanent Instructor) staff conducted classes on various subjects. Regular parades were organized every Wednesday and Saturday.

Cadets were consistently assigned to attend diverse camps held at the All India level, state level, and unit level. They actively took part in social service initiatives such as blood donation drives, tree planting, campus cleaning, pulse polio immunization projects, community works, AIDS awareness programs, cancer awareness programs, water cleaning programs, etc. Various types of rallies, awareness programs, and other social activities were successfully completed, highlighting the importance of these programs. Senior rank holder cadets led these activities responsibly.

## Health check-up of cadets



A health camp was organized in the NCC Clubhouse for all cadets and PI staff to raise awareness about health check-ups and maintaining a healthy lifestyle. The program commenced at 0800 hrs with an introductory speech delivered by our respected Commanding Officer, Lt. Col. S. Srivastav, and the head of the visiting medical team. By 0900 hrs, all participants were directed to form a line for height and weight measurements to calculate BMI (Body Mass Index), providing insights into their health status. The majority of cadets demonstrated a BMI within the normal range.

By 1300 hrs, every cadet and PI staff member underwent assessments for BMI, blood reports, and other health conditions, if any. Doctors provided personalized advice on diet and exercise to maintain a healthy lifestyle. Some individuals were recommended to have their eyes checked for spectacles due to perceived changes in their vision. Our college garnered the highest number of healthy cadets, earning appreciation from both doctors and officers. We were pleased to learn valuable insights from the medical professionals and hope that NCC continues organizing such campaigns annually to promote a healthy cadet count and reduce absenteeism. Every Battalion should consider similar initiatives to foster a healthy environment within the NCC. The program concluded with an overall health report presented by the doctors. ANO (Associate NCC Officer) and officers acknowledged that we were generally healthy and encouraged us to strive for improvement. We express our gratitude to all the doctors and nurses for their time and dedication to our Battalion's well-being.

## Blood donation at NCC Club House



On May 13, 2019 (Monday), the KOL-B Group of West Bengal & Sikkim Dte organized a blood donation camp with the aim of assisting Thalassemia patients. The event took place at the NCC Club House in Kolkata. Brigadier S.K. Das, the Commanding Officer of KOL-B, extended an invitation to Major General S.C. Sing, the Commanding Officer of West Bengal & Sikkim, to be the chief guest for the occasion.

The program commenced around 0900 hrs in the morning, with Brigadier S.K. Das leading by example and donating blood. Senior cadets from each battalion actively participated in the event, alongside several Associate NCC Officers (ANO) and faculty members. The collected blood was intended for donation to the Government Thalassemia Hospital.

Additionally, the KOL-B Group arranged a resting room for those who might feel dizzy or unwell after donating blood. Volunteers from each battalion played a crucial role in organizing and supporting the blood donation camp.

Following the completion of the donation process, ANO Sir and Madam expressed gratitude to everyone present at the camp. The day concluded with the singing of the National Anthem and the NCC song, followed by a heartfelt vote of thanks from Brigadier S.K. Das, the Commanding Officer of the KOL-B group.

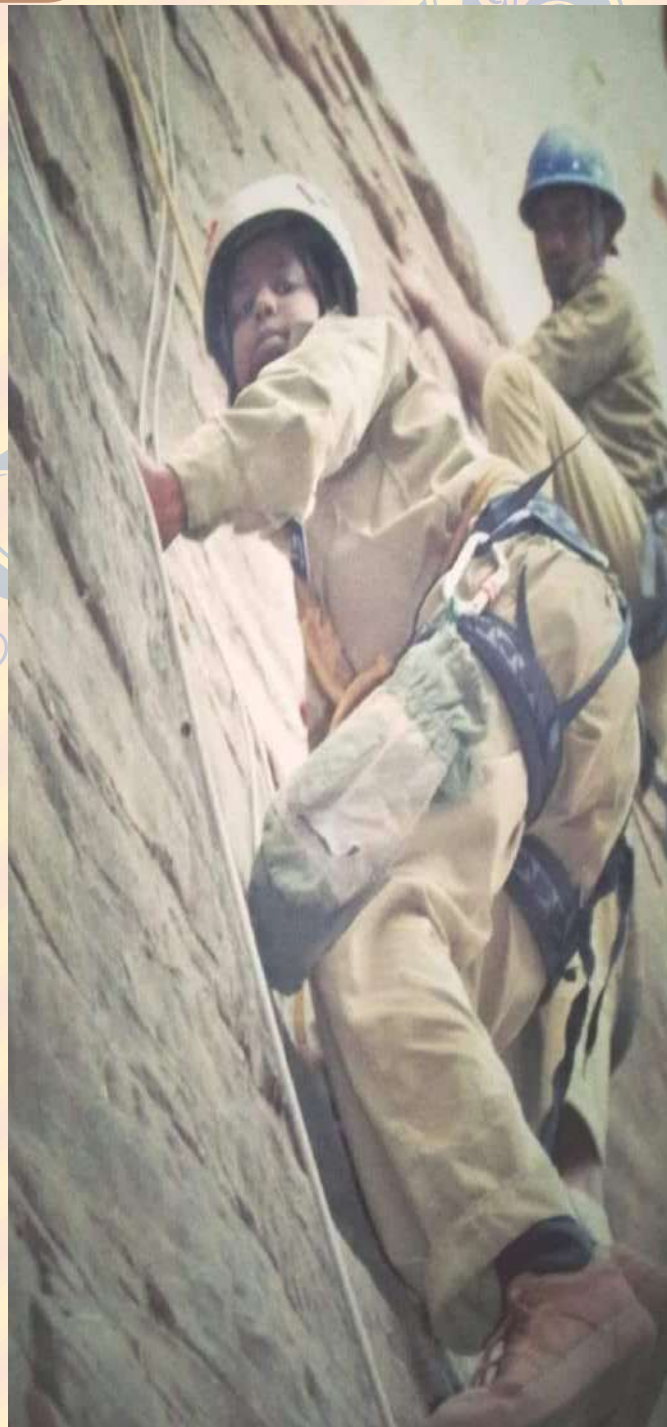

## Adventure Training Camp by TDC cadet Sukumoni Murmu

NCC organizes visits for young students to hill stations, where they participate in trekking and rock climbing expeditions. Cadets who excel in such events have the opportunity to attend various National Institutes of Mountaineering. Volunteers are also given the chance to partake in mountaineering expeditions, encompassing activities such as trekking, rock climbing, courses at National Institutes of Mountaineering, and mountaineering expeditions.

NCC conducts two mountaineering expeditions annually, one for girl cadets and another for boy cadets. Since 1970, NCC has successfully executed 75 mountaineering expeditions, with 40 designated for boys and 35 for girls. Some of the conquered peaks by NCC cadets include Mt. Rudugaira (5819m), Mt. Deo Tibba (6001m), Mt. Gangotri I (6672m), and Mt. Kamet (7746m). Our college cadet, Sukumoni Murmu, represented our battalion by participating in a mountaineering expedition, the All India Trekking Expedition. Additionally, 29 trekking expeditions are conducted annually, attracting the participation of 14,500 cadets from all State NCC Directorates.

The purpose of the session was to refine and enhance the cadets' proficiency in drill manoeuvres, fostering discipline, coordination, and teamwork among them. The cadets exhibited dedication and improvement in executing drill maneuvers with precision and coordination. Such sessions are integral to fostering discipline and camaraderie among cadets, preparing them for future challenges and responsibilities.



The primary objective of parade ground drill is to instill and maintain in a recruit a high standard of discipline, turnout, bearing, and pride in oneself and in the Force. In addition to fostering these qualities within the force, well-executed parade ground drill also indirectly cultivates individual self-respect and instills a sense of power, cohesion, and purpose in the Force. Drill facilitates the coordination between the mind and body, serving as the foundation for imparting other service training.

Drill is essentially marching. In ancient times, the most powerful, efficient, and developed empires devised ways of moving troops from one place to another without them becoming entangled with other troops. Hence, they marched together from one location to another, a practice also known as drill.



Overall, the drill system worked: Soldiers stayed together and could be commanded as a group.

These days, military drill is mostly used for ceremonies, such as Republic Day parades, Independence Day parade, and to instill pride and discipline during military training (such as basic training). In fact, the military drill manual confidently states that drill is the foundation of discipline in battle, and that its importance has been proven again and again.

## SwachhataPakhwada Abhiyan by Battalion HQ in TDC



The Ministry of Tourism (MoT), with the goal of maintaining cleanliness at tourist destinations across the country, has initiated an awareness campaign on cleanliness through a fortnightly drive called "SwachhataPakhwada." The 3 Bengal Bn NCC HQ provided instructions to organize an awareness rally about "SwachhataPakhwada" in Tarakeswar. This holy place of God Mahadev is treated as a tourist destination by the government administration. SwachhataPakhwada commenced in April 2016, aiming to bring a fortnight of concentrated focus on Swachhata issues and practices by involving various Ministries and Departments. Competitions related to SwachhataPakhwada 2019 were held in the college auditorium on the same date, featuring numerous activities organized for students. The main objective of the program was to raise awareness about water conservation and the ban on single-use plastic. The program kicked off with fun activities like heads-up, merry-go-round, and minute-to-win-it games, designed to attract the crowd and promote SwachhataPakhwada.

## World Forest Day celebration:





Cadets of the NCC department at Tarakeswar Degree College celebrated World Forest Day on the college campus to create a wall magazine, raising awareness among all students about our environment. In November 1971, the "States members" at the 16th session of the Conference of the Food and Agriculture Organization voted to establish "World Forestry Day" on March 21 of each year. From 2007 to 2012, the Centre for International Forestry Research (CIFOR) convened a series of six Forest Days in conjunction with annual meetings of the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change Conference of Parties. CIFOR organized these events on behalf of and in close cooperation with other members of the Collaborative Partnership on Forests (CPF). Following the International Year of Forests in 2011, the International Day of Forests was established by resolution of the United Nations General Assembly on November 28, 2012. The catalyst for Forest Day was a casual conversation in Oxford, England, in February 2007, between two scientists who felt the world was underestimating the importance of forests in mitigating carbon emissions and saw a glaring need for the latest forestry research and thinking to inform global policymakers and UNFCCC negotiators. They did not foresee that the conference would become one of the most influential global events on forests and climate change today.

## International Yoga Day:



The International Day of Yoga, observed on June 21, has been celebrated in Srirampore since 2021, following its inception at the battalion HQ, Srirampore General Assembly. Yoga, a practice with physical, mental, and spiritual aspects originating in ancient India, was proposed for this date by Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi in his 2014 UN address. The UN adopted the draft resolution "Day of

Yoga" in 2014, with broad support from 177 Member States.

The significance of June 21, the longest day in the Northern Hemisphere, was emphasized by Modi, aligning with Indian calendars and cultural events like Guru Purnima in Hindu mythology. Following the UN resolution, leaders worldwide supported the initiative, including Ravi Shankar, founder of the Art of Living, who highlighted the importance of official recognition by the UN.

The first International Day of Yoga took place on June 21, 2015, with significant participation in New Delhi. The Ministry of AYUSH organized the event, attracting 35,985 participants from 84 nations, including PM Modi. This marked the largest yoga class globally, setting a precedent for annual celebrations in India and worldwide.

## Tree Plantation Program:



The Department of NCC at Tarakeswar Degree College organized a tree-planting event on 15th September 2021. The cadets of the NCC department actively participated in this event. The Commanding Officer (CO) of the 3 Bengal BN NCC was invited to be a part of this event, while two PI Staff members attended the event on behalf of the CO, sir. The cadets, along with the teachers, agreed to plant trees in the college campus.

Various types of tree saplings, such as peepal, cinnamon, neem, and eucalyptus, were planted on the school premises. The geography teachers were asked to explain to the students the importance of the different trees that were planted. ANO (Associate NCC Officer) sir, along with the Principal, also planted a cinnamon tree. He spoke about how planting trees helps regulate the temperature and absorb carbon dioxide from the air.

Senior cadets discussed how planting trees makes the surroundings greener and provides homes for many birds and animals. They also suggested that every student should plant at least one tree per year to contribute to the fight against global warming. The day's event concluded with the Principal giving a vote of thanks. All the students were given a sapling each to plant at home.

"As India's first Chief of Defence Staff, the General Officer worked on diverse aspects relating to our armed forces, most notably defense reforms. His insight and perspectives on strategic matters were exceptional," it said. The Army mentioned that the nation will never forget his yeoman service toward fostering an enduring culture of jointmanship and integration in the armed forces.

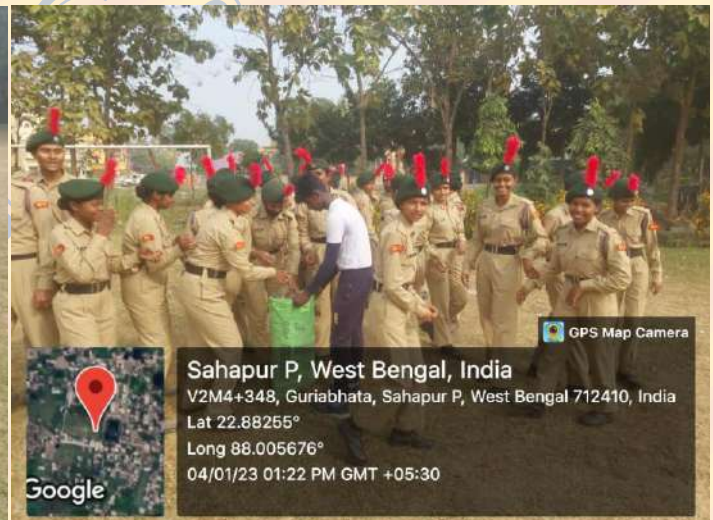

The MoU, to remain in force for a period of three years, aims at consolidating, developing, and detailing their cooperation and effectiveness to achieve the common objectives in the field of the environment.
